There are currently no outside railings beside the steps at our house at 824 N. Chauncey. We would like for hand railings to be installed for safety's sake. Mr. Fence-It at 777 Cordale Road, Lafayette, IN has given us an oral quote which is acceptable to us. There are two sets of steps. They are not in total alignment with each other so the top hand railing would be slightly more to the north than the bottom railing. The support poles for the railings would be in the ground to the left of the steps (looking from the street), anchored with concrete. Height of railing would be 42". Material of railings is steel.

Re: 824 N. Chauncey, West Lafayette, IN 47906 Outside step railings (continuation of description of proposed work)

The length of the railing for the lower set of (those that begin at the sidewalk) would be 8 feet.

I think the length of the hand railing for the upper set of steps would be 4 feet – but Gene from Mr. Fence It has not yet confirmed this. He said he would need to cut down an 8 foot length to make it the right length.

As to specs for the railings, the material is steel. Color is black. Gene from Mr Fence It will provide more information as to specs if it is necessary.

Our neighbor at 828 N. Chauncey, West Lafayette, has a railing installed by Mr. Fence It. Ours would replicate the one at 828 except that:

- 1) We would have 2 railings that match each other, one for each set of steps; and
- 2) I think the distance from the ground to the hand railing for our neighbor's house at 828 N. Chauncey is 36" while ours would be 42"
- 3) Her railing on the steps next to the sidewalk is on the right hand side (looking from the street). Ours would be on the left.

Regarding 42" for the distance from the ground to the handrail, it would be ok if the distance were 36" but my husband is tall so he prefers the higher railing.

We do not want to install the posts for the railings in the red bricks out of concern that drilling into the bricks would cause them to deteriorate. And we think that using the technique of anchoring the posts in concrete would make the railings more sturdy. Our neighbor's railing is quite sturdy.

I previously emailed photos of our steps to the Building Division. I also sent photos of the railing in front of our neighbor's house at 828 that we would like to replicate, as above stated.

Please let me know if you need more information from me. My husband and I are out of town and will not be back until late tomorrow night.

Mr. Spitznagle,

I spoke with you last week about the proposed railings for our outside steps at our house at 824 N. Chauncey.

I am going to forward to you the photos I took of our front steps.

I will shortly also send photos of our neighbor's railing to the north at 828 N. Chauncey.

The work will be done by Mr. Fence it. 777 Cor-Dale Rd, Lafayette, IN 47904 765-742-4822

Our railings will be of the same material as the neighbor's - steel - will look the same, same rigidity, strength of material, dimensions of railing and poles (this information is from Mr. Fence it).

We will want 2 section of railings installed by Mr. Fence it. (The neighbor at 828 N. Chauncey Avenue has just one section). One, for the steps that begin at the sidewalk in front of our house, will be 8 feet long. I think the one for the upper 2 steps, just outside the front door, will be 4 feet long but that has not yet been confirmed by Gene from Mr. Fence It.

The sections of railings will be installed in the ground beside the steps. Both railings will be to the left as one faces the house. It is my understanding that Mr. Fix it will pour concrete in the ground to hold the railing in place.

Please let me know if you have questions. Or you can contact Mr. Fix It.

I am going on a short trip today, returning late tomorrow. There will be times when I do not have a phone signal. My cell, however, is **Terretories** I will have internet access.

Mr. Fence it said he can get the work done soon - I think he said this week. We will wait to give him the go-ahead until I hear from you.
