Ordinance No. 07-17 An Ordinance Amending Ordinance No. 32-97 Being The Unified Zoning Ordinance Of Tippecanoe County. (UZO Amendment #89) (Fence Height in West Lafayette) (Submitted by Area Plan Commission)

President Bunder read Ordinance No. 07-17 by title only.

Director of Development Carlson stated that this is an addition to the fence ordinance for the UZO, done at his request due to some conflicts with the Historic Preservation Commission (HPC). As the law reads, a fence of more than 42 inches in a side yard that has street frontage is technically an illegal fence. However, it is something we see in many places, and it has not been enforced anywhere in Tippecanoe County. This is cleaning up the law to allow for people to have these fences when they get approval from the Administrative Officer, which is Building Commissioner Spitznagle. He explained that if anyone wants a new fence, even to replace an existing fence in the HPC overlay, it needs approval from the Development Department, and he cannot approve a fence that is illegal. The APC has unanimously approved this. He noted that Building Commissioner Spitznagle will speak about this at the Council meeting.
